- ❖ Working with the CHN

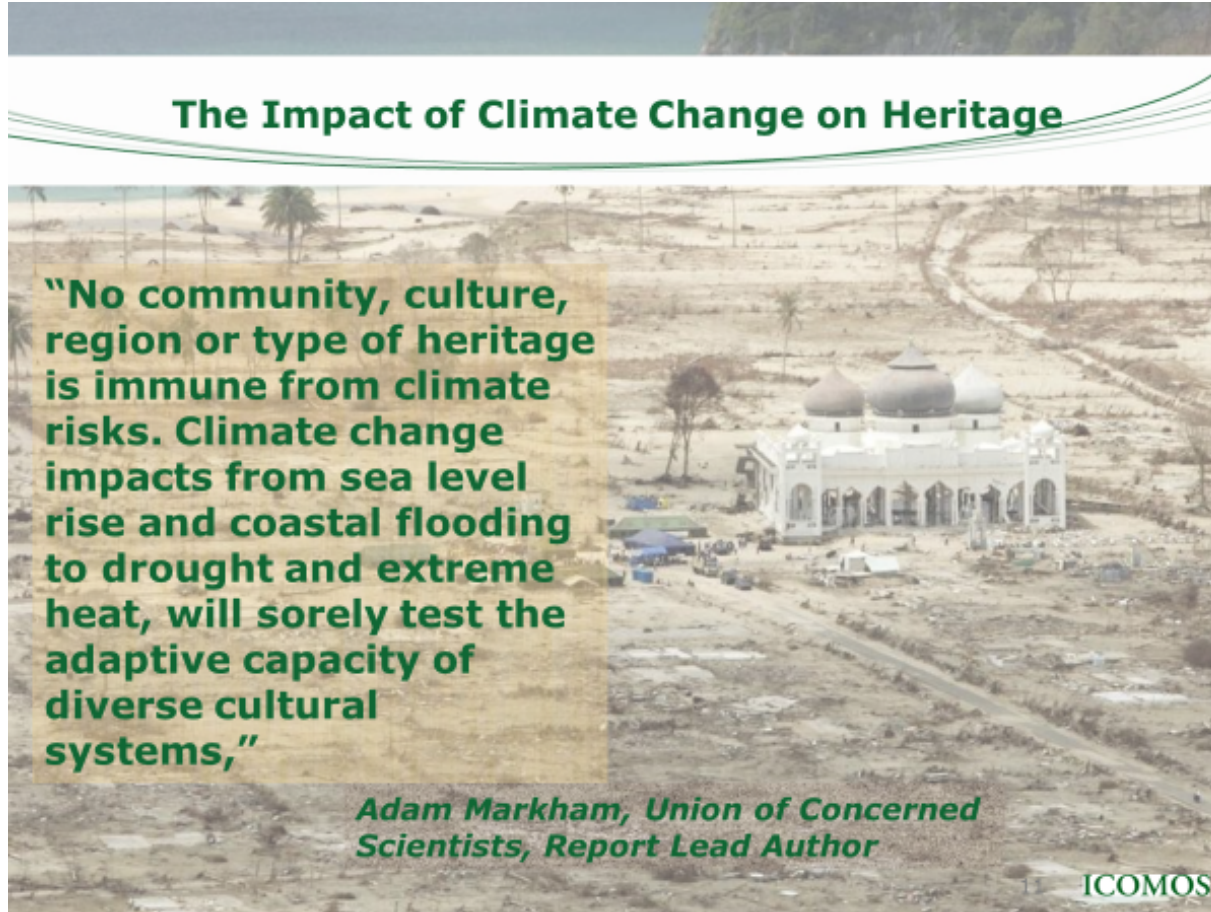
